<u>Top Tips</u>

- The secret to success is practising little and often.

 Incorporate this into your child's play / everyday activities. For example. I need 5 forks to lay the table. I have 3 already. How many more do I need?

 Ask your child to repeat the number sentence after they've answered a question. For example above, say,

"3 and 2 make 5"

- Spot how numbers are made up in images. For example, I can see 3 birds: 2 flying in the sky and 1 on the fence. 2 and 1 make 3.

How many more do I need to make ____? (E.g. 5) How do you see the 4 ____? (E.g. birds)
