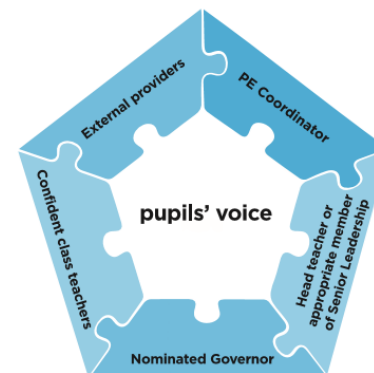
### Themes of Achievement:

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| <p>Increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport.</p> | <p>Monitoring &amp; training of teachers for PE through the use of Premier Education, who will first hand quality training through the Long Term Plan of Castle Wood Academy.</p> | <p>Castle Wood Academy is committed to improving the confidence of the teachers in the school to deliver quality PE lesson.</p> <p>With a carefully adapted and widened PE curriculum with a wide range of sports being taught that had previously not been taught, it is important that teachers have the knowledge of these sports.</p> <p>Through the help of Premier Education throughout the year, each year group will have support in delivering quality lesson at least two terms throughout the year. 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| <p>Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement</p> | <p>A regular newsletter to be sent home to parents, establishing the connection between school and parents about PE in school.</p> <p>Re-establish playleaders under a new format.</p> <p>A timetable during play times to ensure every child in school has access to all areas of the playground to play a variety of sports.</p> | <p>Castle Wood Academy is committed to establishing a strong link between parents and school. Therefore, in order to raise the profile of the school, a termly newsletter will go out to parents, explaining the learning the children have been doing in PE throughout the term, visits that have been conducted by external bodies, visits and competitions completed by the children and most importantly, success stories from the children through pupil voice.</p> <p>So as to ensure the need for all pupils is met during playtimes and lunchtimes, a bespoke timetable will be implemented to ensure inclusivity for all, including a girls football day (which also ensures girls playing with boys), no football days and different year groups playing with each other. 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| Enhance the outside learning environment so as to ensure an increase in competitive activities for the children. | A football afterschool club open to all children across the school over the course of the academic year.   | Children need to be able to access the outdoor area of school to allow them to increase fitness, stamina and endurance. Furthermore, an increase in the exposure to competitive sports allows children to work in teams, become resilient and acceptant in defeat and aspire to better themselves in the future.<br><br>A football afterschool club run through Premier Education will ensure that children are exposed to and can aspire to these attributes. With public support increasing in popularity for the women's game, this will be open to both girls and boys. This will be on a full term basis for each year group, with year 5 in Autumn, year 4 in Spring and year 3 in Summer.  | Due to restrictions during Covid, many of the children in these year groups have not been exposed to swimming lessons from a young age. It is essential that these children attend swimming lessons and water safety sessions in order to increase confidence and resilience in water and expose them to a sport that might be unfamiliar to them. Children need to be supported if not feeling confident and challenged wherever possible to ensure engagement and aspiration. Efforts need to be made to upskill all staff. This includes teaching assistants, who should be confident in supporting the class teacher and supporting children where required.
