I make comments and ask questions about the things I see around me.

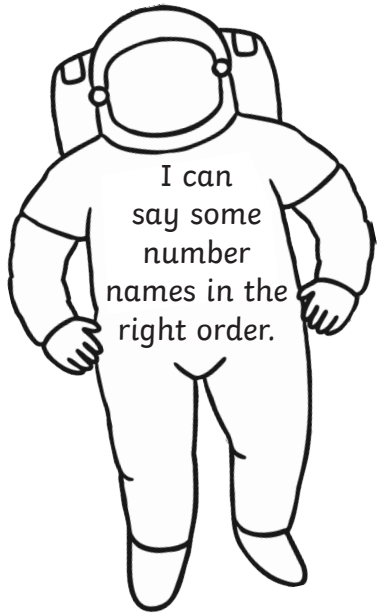
I can wash and dry my hands on my own.

I can use the toilet by myself most of the time.

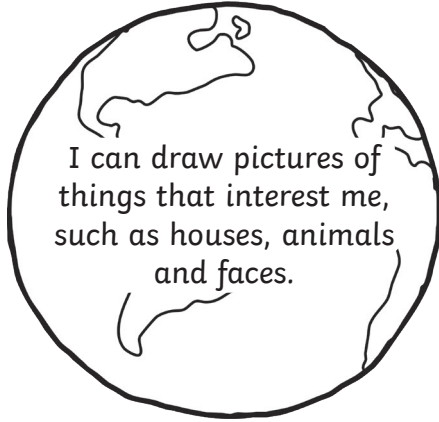
I can listen to stories and join in with the parts of the story that I know.

I hold books carefully when I look at them.

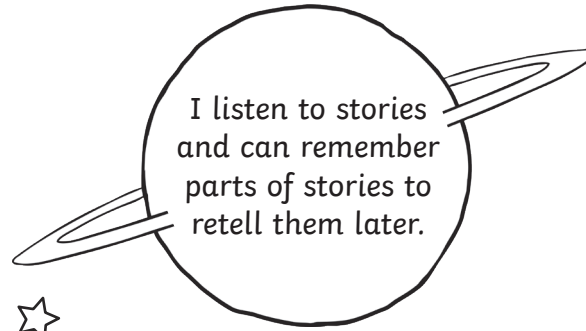
I can usually wait to take my turn and share toys with other children.



I can say some number names in the right order.



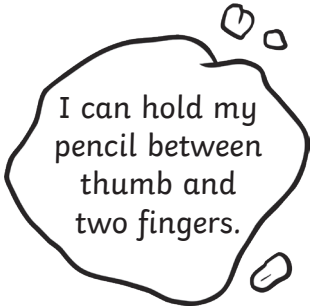
I can draw pictures of things that interest me, such as houses, animals and faces.



I listen to stories and can remember parts of stories to retell them later.



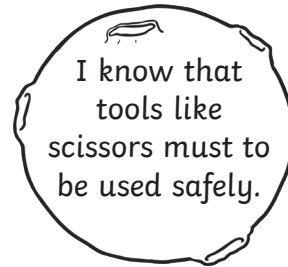
I can talk about my family and tell others about the things I have been doing.



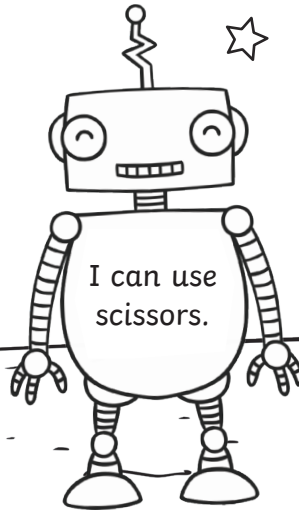
I can hold my pencil between thumb and two fingers.



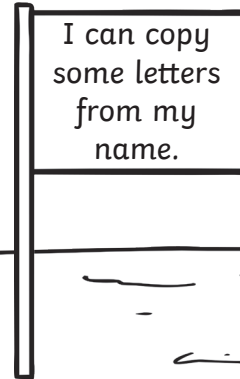
I can put my coat on by myself but need help with zips and buttons.



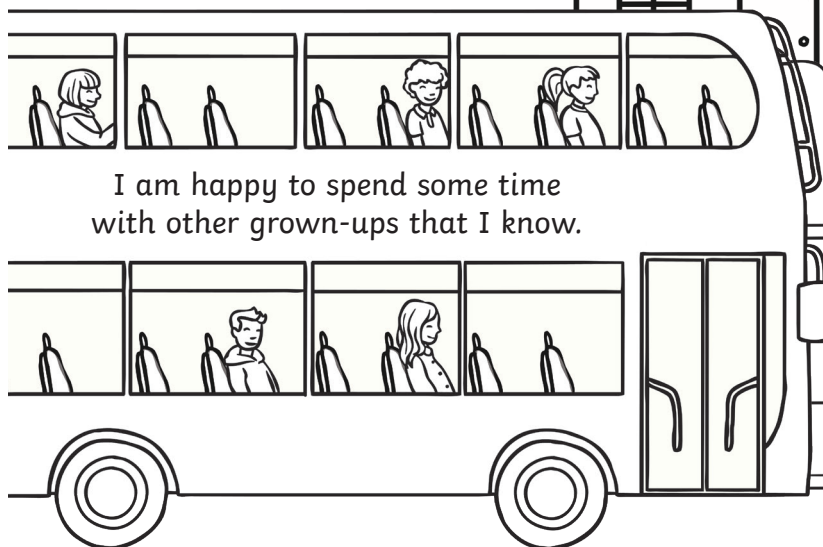
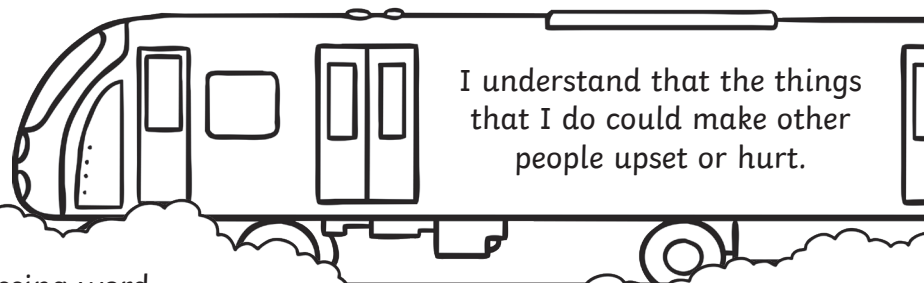
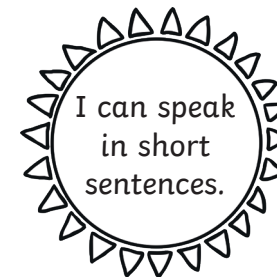
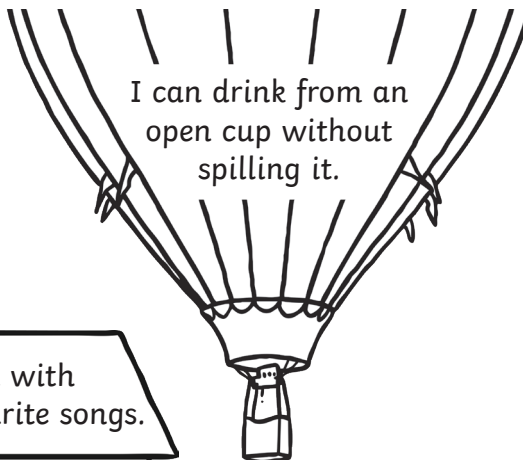
I know that tools like scissors must be used safely.
