Vision

Professional Learning and your PE team - Ensuring appropriate subject leadership and staff training.


- Improve quality of teaching and learning of PE.

Castle Wood Academy is committed to improving the confidence of the teachers in the school to deliver quality PE lesson. With a carefully adapted and widened PE curriculum with a wide range of sports being taught that had previously not been taught, it is important that teachers have the knowledge of these sports. Through the help of Premier Education throughout the year, each year group will have support in delivering quality lesson at least two terms throughout the year. This will allow the teachers to be able to have the confidence for the rest of the academic year to deliver first hand quality teaching with the knowledge gained from Premier Education.
