What will I do at school?





There are lots of things to do outdoors, such as... playing with sand and water, or playing in the mud kitchen. In the classroom, there are lots of things to play with and a crafts area and a reading den.

The teacher reminds Sam to flush the toilet afterwards to keep it clean and to wash carefully at one of the basins. Sam goes straight back to the classroom after finishing.

What happens in the outdoor learning area?

How do I follow the rules at school?

She has told him that it is a reward because he has been exceptionally good on his first day at school.

Sometimes pegs might be moved onto the cloud. This only happens if bad or unkind choices are made. The teacher will encourage the child to have their peg moved back to the sunshine or rainbow by making better choices.
